

MINUTES

July 10, 2002

Meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Sheli Lulkin, president.

The presentation on the Lincoln Park Framework Plan by Betsy Altman was postponed to the September meeting.

Chuck Eastwood moved, seconded by Jill Niland, to adopt the agenda as printed. Motion carried unanimously. Vickie Mathews moved, seconded by Mary Gray, to accept the minutes as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

Vickie Mathews presented the treasurer's report. We have \$21,619.87 in net assets. Our treasurer needs cooperation of past treasurers who are not forthcoming with all documents. If we don't have all records by September counsel should be obtained. Mary Gray moved, seconded by Fred Sickler, to adopt the treasurer's report as given. Motion carried unanimously.

Dana Zilinski, gave the Park District Report and spoke on Belmont and L.S.D. Arthur Telsler Playlot commemoration. Regarding the Craft Mobile, the Park district has rented a van with staff and supplies. The van is mobile and provides supplies free of charge to park patrons at different locations and times to paint in the park. Wilson avenue skate Park task force meeting to come. Proposed track at South Field, meeting 8-8-02 6:30 p.m. Nature Museum. Southfield baseball diamond has sprinklers..

President Sheli Lulkin suggest we send out notice about the meeting and to further discuss our position in our September meeting.

John Davidson of Margate Park reported on expanding the fitness center. Should be completed mid to late August. \$20.00 for twenty visits. Movie outside of Margate Park fieldhouse on 8-8-02 "Mad Mad World". Mr. Davidson thanked LPAC for our help.

Cindi Jahraus, gave thanks to LPAC for the money for a new Santa Suit. The District now has an electric golf cart to survey, park work orders and keep track of campers. It has been very useful and has added to productivity, however the cart has charging problems. Lincoln Park thru a photo lense had over 200 entries and will be on display 11:00 a.m. till 6:00p.m. Saturdays and Sundays at the Cultural Center in the fall. LPAC president helped judge the entries. 350 campers enrolled in camp in the park. Pathways Art in the Park makes available free supplies to sit and Paint in the park. There will be a cultural program noon till 1:00 p.m. North Ave. Beach at lunchtime second week of August . Different cultural artist each time.

President Shell Lulkin, gave the president's report and spoke on various items of concern including:

Replacing removed benches at construction of new Beachhouse at North Ave.

Principles for Chicago's new Zoning Ordinance, would create a new Zoning District for the Parks. Jill Niland volunteered to contact Friends of the Park and find out what their position is.

First permit issued for the North End of the Park. Two day festival 9:00 a.m. till 4:00 p.m. 8-24-02 and 8-25-02 at Hollywood Beach.

There are areas of the park where permits will not be issued. We are looking for Concerts on the North Lakefront. Queer as Polka and the Peoples Music School will be the first groups to offer concerts at Osterman Beach.

Vickie Matthews moved, seconded by Fred Sickler, to skip the August meeting and meet in September as is our custom. Motion carried unanimously. The next meeting will be the second week of September at the Lincoln Park Cultural Center.

New Business: President Sheli Lulkin introduced a discussion of benches. Benches at North Avenue beach can create conversation areas, also a place to sit and wait for the bus. Chuck and Frank to help locate placement of the benches. Conversation and social seating is also desirable at Hollywood.

Frank Fuscaldo moved, seconded by Vicki Mathews to write letter on street racing. Send an inquiry letter to Mayors office of special events Vote: 2 opposed 6 Aye c.c. Aldermen and David Doig.
